

Viburnums include both deciduous and evergreen shrubs and while a diverse lot, they can usually be recognized by their toothed leaves arranged in opposite pairs along the stems, flattened clusters of small white flowers and berry-like fruits. Once the fruits are stripped from the deciduous types at this time of year, the evergreens come into their own, and the David C. Lam Asian Garden is a good place to see them.
